

George Scott has spent his life serving others. He was raised on a family farm in south central Pennsylvania and attended public school. After graduating from Georgetown University with a degree in International Politics, George entered the U.S. Army and served on active duty for 20 years in both peace and war. He deployed for Operations Just Cause, Desert Shield, Desert Storm, and Enduring Freedom. After commanding a battalion of 1,800 soldiers, he retired as a lieutenant colonel.

In 2009, George returned home, attended the United Lutheran Seminary in Gettysburg, earned a Master of Divinity degree, and began serving as a pastor. He took an unpaid leave of absence from ministry in 2018 in order to run as a Democratic candidate for Congress in PA's 10th Congressional District. After winning a four-way race in the primary, George went on to earn 48.7% of the vote in the general election.

George's long career in public service has taken him from coast to coast in the US and from the Far East to the Middle East. Yet, throughout it all, George's home has always been south-central Pennsylvania. He and his wife Donna, a small business owner, reside in Harrisburg. George is also the proud father of two children.
